Dog Licenses

With a new year comes new dog licenses! In compliance with Sevier County's Animal Control Ordinance, which has been adopted by the Town, all dogs must be licensed and registered by Monday, March 1st, 2021 and provide proof of a current rabies vaccination. Dog licenses not obtained by March 1st will be subject to a late fee of \$25.00 per dog.

Licensing fees are \$10.00 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$35.00 for unaltered dogs. Kennel licenses and Conditional Use Permits are required for individuals owning three or more dogs.

Annabella Town will sponsor the annual dog clinic on

**Saturday, February 13th from
10:00 a.m.-Noon at the old Town Hall
(90 North Main Street).**

Dr. Johnson of the Richfield Veterinary Clinic will be on hand to provide rabies and parvo vaccinations. Dog owners will also be able to license and register their pet(s) with the Town. Watch for a reminder in next month's newsletter. If your rabies vaccination is still current, you can add the license fee to your utility payment, drop it in the drop box, call and pay via credit/debit card or stop by the Town Office. If the rabies vaccination is not current, a current one will need to be presented before obtaining a dog license.

The following issues were discussed during the December Town Council meeting. Town residents with questions, concerns, or those wishing to obtain additional information are encouraged to phone the Town Office or contact a member of the Town Council.

The Town Council:

- Held a public hearing receive input on the issuance of street improvement revenue bonds and any potential economic impact to the private sector. It was noted during the public hearing that CIB has authorized \$933,333 grant and \$400,000 loan at 0.5% interest to be paid in ten installments. The payments will be made from B&C road revenue.
- Discussed additional grant options available to help with road improvements.



BILL PAY

If you have an internet connection & an email address, you can pay your bill online. You can also “opt in” to paperless billing & receive a notification when your bill is ready to view. Enterprise Zone Tax Credit

Great news! Annabella has been approved for a renewal of the Enterprise Zone designation. The Utah Enterprise Zone Tax Credit program promotes economic development and business growth in Utah’s rural areas. Under this program, qualifying businesses may claim Utah tax credits.
