The following issues were discussed during the February Town Council meeting. Town residents with questions, concerns, or those wishing to obtain additional information are encouraged to phone the Town Hall or contact a member of the Town Council.

- Doug Wood presented ideas and measurements for a cemetery entrance.
- The Town Council presented Doug Wood with a certificate of appreciation, signed by Lieutenant Governor Cox & the director of Utah Commission on Service & Volunteerism. Chanel Hawley was also a recipient of the volunteerism certificate.
- The Town Council discussed the Culinary Water Improvement Project and bid opening. Bids were higher than the engineer's estimate so a work meeting was set and additional funding has been requested. When considering additional funding, the Town Council took into consideration that the interest rate on the loan has dropped significantly since the beginning of the funding process. The interest rate has decreased enough that, even with the additional funding requested, the monthly bond payments will remain slightly lower than the original funding package.
