Spring Clean Up

Spring has sprung in Annabella!

As we get ready for the hustle and bustle the warmer weather invites, residents can take advantage of Annabella's Spring Clean Up!

This clean up allows residents a convenient way to get rid of extra garbage or large items that might typically need to be hauled to the landfill.

The Spring Clean Up dumpster will be at the Town Shop (50 West 300 South) is scheduled for:

Friday, April 23rd

(sometime before noon)

through **Sunday, May 2nd**

That's two full weekends to clean out the stuff you don't want around your house & yard!

Please remember that there are still restrictions on what can be placed in the dumpster-no cement, tires, appliances, batteries, or paint. Also, tree limbs must be no longer than 3 feet in length.



Please help us to keep this service available by obeying the dumpster restrictions and placing garbage inside the dumpster (rather than next to it).

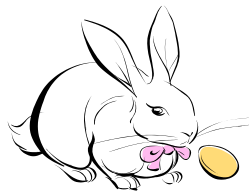

Municipal Election Year

2021 is a municipal election year. Annabella residents wishing to file as a candidate for the office of Mayor or Annabella Town Councilmember may do so between

June 1, 2021 & June 7, 2021
The filing deadline is June 7th at 5:00 p.m.

Annabella Town residents will be electing a Mayor and two Councilmembers to serve four-year terms at the general municipal election on November 2, 2021. The Primary Election date is August 10, 2021 (if needed).

Each person wishing to become a candidate for municipal office shall file a declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition in person with the Annabella Town Clerk at 295 East 300 North, Annabella, during regular business hours and not later than 5:00 p.m. June 7, 2021.

There is no filing fee.
